Information Centres

Our Information Centres are open to everyone in the community. We provide a confidential signposting service where we provide options, support, and guidance for individuals and their families experiencing mental health difficulties. Options around Outreach Counselling Services are also available.

School's Education Programmes

The MindOut Programme is an evidence based social and emotional learning programme which was first developed in 2004. The aim of this programme is to support the social, emotional, and mental wellbeing of young people aged 15–18 years in post-primary schools.

MindOut is a joint project in partnership with the Mental Health Ireland, HSE, University of Ireland Galway, Mayo Mental Health Association and Mindspace Mayo.

Mayo MHA manages and coordinates the rollout of MindOut in County Mayo. We provide one to one support to teachers delivering the programme at a local level.

The Breathe Programme is an evidence based educational talk to promote, participate, and facilitate mental health awareness and well-being for students in an interactive format. We are currently involved with 29 secondary schools in Mayo and engage with up to 12,000 students per the academic year across the county. We are currently involved with 27 secondary schools in Mayo and engage with up to 10,500 pupils across the county.

The Breathe Programme is also facilitated as part of the larger health promotion area of work and we also deliver it to various community groups, organisations, and sporting bodies.

Our Community Liaison Officer with Mayo MHA, facilitates **Fractured** – an educational talk for secondary school students and community groups which discusses resilience building.

Health Promotion

Mayo Mental Health Association run several key mental health promotion initiatives each year to support our community here in Mayo on various topics that support their understanding on key mental health issues. Initiatives which we are involved in include Out The Gap, Turlough 8k, 'Hello, How Are You?', and World Mental Health Day.

Social Housing

Mayo MHA run a very successful and modern social housing project which we are currently in partnership with the HSE, St. Vincent de Paul, and Mayo County Council. We own and manage social housing units made up of 1 and 2 bed apartments and housing stock, and provide accommodation for more than 40 residents across Mayo. Our overall aim is to ensure the successful allocation of sustainable tenancies in a fair, transparent, and accountable way.

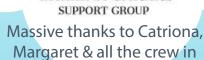

Out The Gap

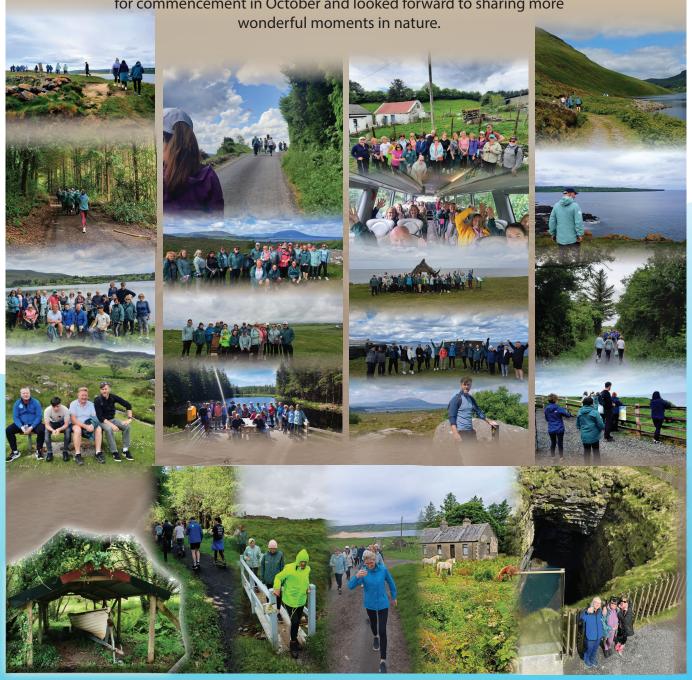

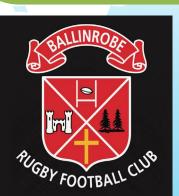

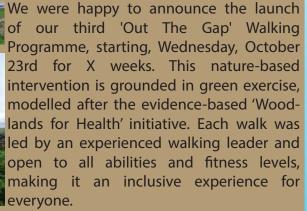
